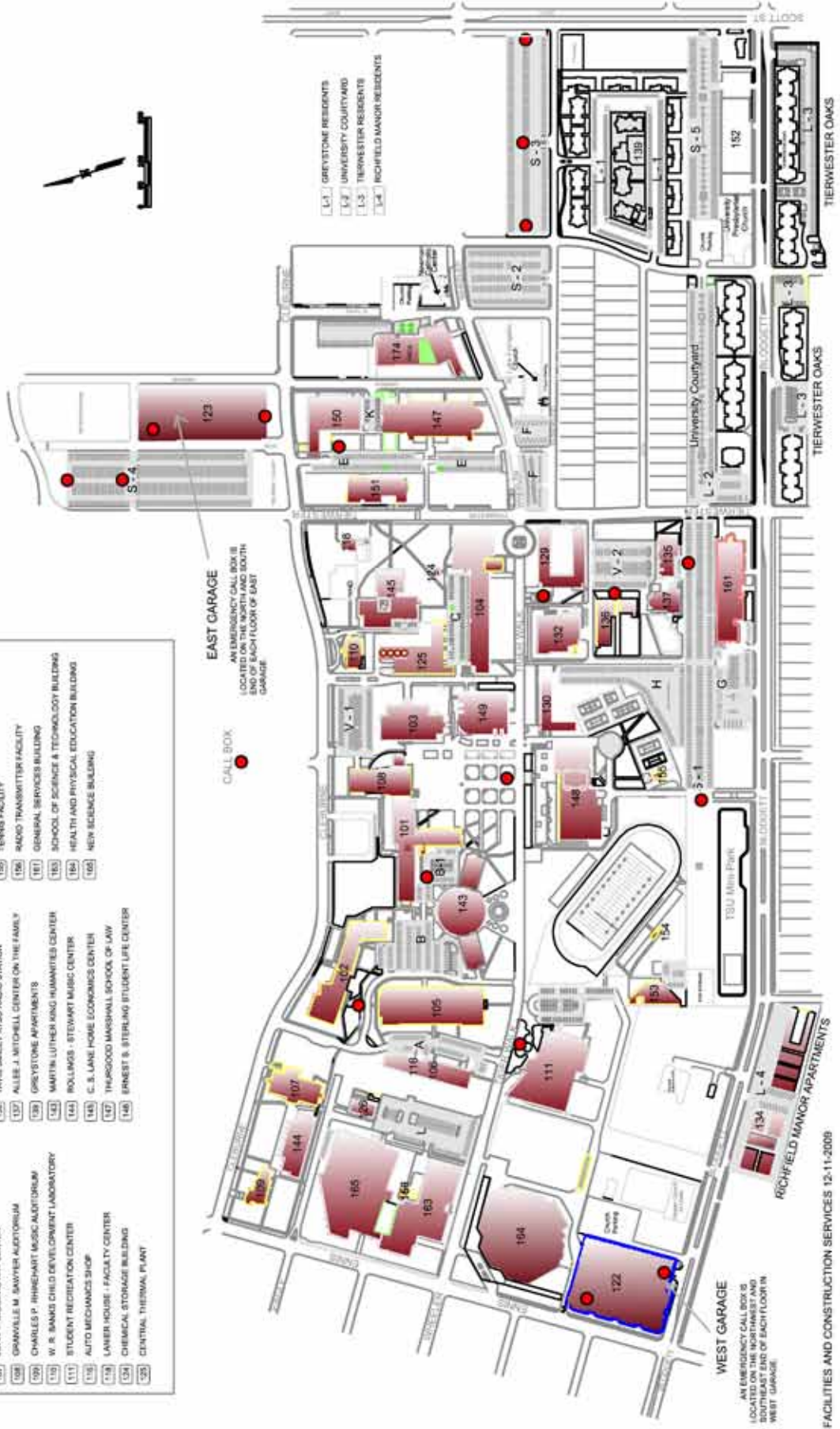

Your application file is completed once you receive a

- Letter of unconditional admission

A completed application file contains

- Paid application fee receipt or receipt for waiver of application fee
- Official final high school transcript or college/university transcript(s)
- Official ACT score and/or SAT score (Freshman application only)

FINANCIAL AID

If you have filed for financial aid*, your file should include

- Email confirmation or Student Aid Report from the U.S. Department of Education indicating FAFSA completed
- Additional documentation required for students that are selected for verification by U.S. Department of Education
- Texas Southern University Authorization Form (new student only)
- Master Promissory Note (if applied for loan)
- Parent Plus application and Master Promissory Note (dependent students only)
- Any outstanding items (check online at www.em.tsu.edu)

* If you have not applied but want to apply for financial aid, please see page 22

HOUSING

If you desire housing, you should have

- Completed and signed the Housing Application Form
- Submitted the following by means of money order or cashier's check
 - Housing Reservation Deposit of \$350.00
 - Refundable security deposit of \$100.00, and
 - Nonrefundable fee of \$250.00 for application/processing/background fee
- Submitted immunization and meningitis records (required as of January 1, 2010)
- Submitted physical examination records (must be within one year of date of submission)
- Completed and signed a Residential Life and Housing Promissory Note
- Completed and signed a Housing Food Service Contract
- Paid your first tuition installment payment or provided the Award Letter showing proof of Financial Aid

Priority deadline for housing applications from first-time freshmen is June 1. Completed applications received after June 1 will be considered on a first-come-first-serve basis. Your application is not considered complete until all required documentation and payments are received. **To receive an application, please call the Housing Office at 713-313-7206.**

If you do not qualify for an exemption*, you must take one of these University-required placement tests before selecting courses. (See page 7 for details)

- ASSET, ACCUPLACER, COMPASS, THEA (THEA is required for Educator Preparation Program)

*You are exempt from testing if you meet or exceed a condition below.

- SAT Scores - 1070 combined score on Verbal and Mathematics Sections with at least 500 on each (single test date) (Valid for five years from test date)
- ACT Scores - Composite - 23, English - 19, Mathematics - 19 (single test date), (Valid for five years from test date)
- TAKS Scores (Exit-Level) - English/Language Arts (ELA) - 2200, Mathematics - 2200, Writing - 3 (Valid for three years from test date)
- TAAS Scores - Writing - 1770, Mathematics - 86, Reading - 89 (single test date), (Valid for three years from test date)
- Associate or Bachelor's degree holder
- Transfer students with satisfactory completion credit
- Active duty military (U.S. armed forces, Texas National Guard or Reserves) with at least three years of service
- Honorably discharged, retired or released military on or after August 1, 1990
- Non-credit or transient students

FEE PAYMENT

Eligibility

You must meet all the following criteria before July 1st

- Submit the following items to the Office of Admissions:

New Freshman Students

- Application
- Application fee
- High School Transcript
- SAT/ACT scores

New Transfer Students

- Application
- Application fee
- All previous college/university transcripts
- Select at least 12 hours of courses for fall 2010 semester

- Student is in good academic standing and has no holds
- Complete housing application process by July 1
- If financial aid recipient, student must do the following
 - Complete FAFSA
 - Complete verification and turn in all required documents
 - Complete Master Promissory Note if requesting for loans

In order to be a registered student by July 1st, the student will need at least half of their tuition and fees paid. Financial aid award can be used towards the first half for eligible students.

TO BE A REGISTERED STUDENT

You must have a **Payment Receipt**, an **Approved Tuition Installment Agreement**, or a **Financial Aid Deferment**.

Payment Receipt

Obtain your payment receipt form in the Student Accounting by paying in full by:

- Cash
- Money order, cashier's check, or personal check
- Credit Card (Visa, MasterCard, American Express, Discover)

Tuition Installments Agreement

- You must first contact the Student Accounting for approval for payment installments.
- Complete the Tuition Installment Agreement Form.
- Following approval, you must make an initial payment of 50% of your fees plus installment fee. The second payment of 25% of the fee is then due and payable in 6 weeks; the third and final payment of the remaining 25% is due and payable in 10 weeks.

Financial Aid Deferment

To be eligible for a Financial Aid Deferment Plan, follow these steps.

- Have on file a current Student Aid Report verifying eligibility for financial aid.
- Contact the Office of Student Financial Assistance.
- Sign the online application for deferment at em.tsu.edu

(to TSU)

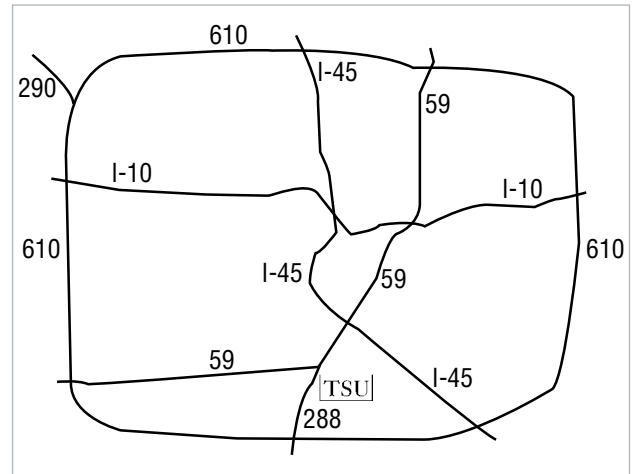
Texas Southern University is located just southeast of downtown Houston. To get to TSU -

From I-45

Take the Scott Street exit. Go south on Scott Street (turn right if going south or turn left if going north), and pass the lights at McGowen, Elgin, and Holman Streets. Turn right at Cleburne Street (Burger King). TSU is on the left, past the Tierwester Street light.

From TX-288

Exit at Southmore Boulevard. Go east on Southmore Boulevard (turn left if going south or turn right if going north), and pass the light at Dowling and Live Oak Streets. Turn left at Ennis Street (at the stop sign). TSU is on the right, just past the Blodgett Street light.



From US-59

US-59 going north, take TX-288 and follow the TX-288 direction. US-59 going south, take I-45 south (towards Galveston) and follow the I-45 directions.

CAMPUS PARKING

(Orientation and General Information Sessions)

The East Garage is located on the corner of Cleburne and Tierwester Streets. (First choice)

The West Garage is located on the corner of Ennis and Blodgett Streets. The Health and Physical Education Building is adjacent to the West Garage parking lot with entrance on the corner of Ennis Street and Wheeler Avenue. (Second choice)

No parking permit is required for the duration of the orientation period.

The Texas Southern University Electronic Deferment Process is designed to defer the payment of the student's current balance based on an expected financial aid disbursement. Obtaining an electronic tuition deferment does not indicate the student has enough financial aid to pay their total outstanding balance with the university and serves as a binding contract between the student and Texas Southern University. You may complete the electronic tuition deferment online at your MyTSUWeb Account.

The Texas Southern University Electronic Deferment Process (EDP) is available to students who:

- are a regularly admitted student into an eligible academic program
- are registered in a minimum of 6 credit hours
- have an official response from the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
- have submitted all supporting documentation including, but not limited to, the verification worksheet, parent and/or student federal income tax returns, and others items requested by the U.S. Department of Education prior to disbursement of Title IV aid
- are not in default on a federal loan
- meet the minimum satisfactory academic progress (SAP) requirements

"THIRD PARTY PAYMENTS" are also available at Texas Southern University. If you are paying through a third party (such as - **DARS** (Department of Assistive and Rehabilitative Services), **Division of Rehabilitation Services**, **TCH** (Texas Children Hospital), **Texas Tomorrow Funds** - Texas Guaranteed Tuition Plan, **The Boeing Company** - Learning Together Program, **ARMY**), follow the steps below -

1. Get an authorization letter from the third party.
2. Submit the authorization letter to the Student Accounting Office - E.O. Bell Building (Basement 109).
3. Your account will be credited after the payment is received from the third party. (Confirm with the Student Accounting Office whether your account has been properly credited by phone at 713-313-7052.)
4. Account balances that are not paid by the third party will be the responsibility of the student. (Contact your third party agency regarding an unpaid balance.)

APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

- Submission begins January 1 of every year.
- Application may be submitted through **the telephone** or **internet at www.fafsa.ed.gov**. **Paper applications may be requested by calling 1-800-433-3243.**
- **Processing time is significantly decreased by using internet and telephone services**
- Applicants will receive email notification or paper response (Student Aid Report) in 2 to 4 weeks, depending on method used to file application.
- Review email or Student Aid Report for corrections and comments as soon as possible.
- **Submission prior to April 15 increases the likelihood of receiving maximum grant eligibility.**

To complete the FAFSA, you will need the following documents:

- A copy of your federal income tax return (if you are a dependent, you will need only your parents' return; if you are married, you will need your return and your spouse's).
- Copies of your most recent bank statements
- The value of current investments
- Business value and debt
- Alien registration number (for permanent residents)
- Social security number (for students; parents if dependent)
- Driver's license

Apply Electronically

Filing electronically increases the accuracy of your application, saves mailing time, and reduces the processing time to about two weeks. The electronic version may be submitted on-line at the U.S. Department of Education web site, www.fafsa.ed.gov. **TSU has computer stations available specifically for filing FAFSA forms. These computers are located in the Bell Building on the first floor, adjacent to the Office of Student Financial Assistance.**

Apply by Phone

FAFSA on the Phone is a non-Web, paperless alternative to completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid. With the assistance of Federal Student Aid Information Center (FSAIC) customer service representatives (CSRs), students are given the flexibility to complete the FAFSA by relaying their information over the telephone. This service is provided free of charge by the U.S. Department of Education.

CLASS ATTENDANCE RULE

All students are required to be present for all class meetings of any course for which they are enrolled. Students are responsible for learning about, becoming knowledgeable of and complying with the attendance policy stated in the catalog and/or faculty syllabus. Faculty members will provide details on the rules for attendance in their classes in their course syllabi. Faculty members will keep students' attendance records.

Record keeping

A record of excused and unexcused absences will be maintained by faculty members. When requested by the student, teachers must inform the student who has been absent whether make-up work is allowed and whether absences jeopardize the student's standing in a class.

Non- Attendance

Students who register for courses for a particular semester must attend their classes starting on the

first-day of class. Students who have not attended classes up to the 12th day of classes will be reported to the Registrar's office for non-attendance. A student who is reported for non-attendance will be dropped from those classes.

Students who have supporting documentation for their absence(s) must present their documentation to the instructor who reported them for non-attendance. The instructor may evaluate their supporting documentation and hear their case. If denied, the student will have to re-register for the course as early as the next semester the class is available. If the instructor approves the student for re-instatement, the instructor will submit a request in writing for the re-instatement to the Dean of the School or College. If the Dean approves the request for reinstatement, the Dean of the School or College will submit in writing to the Registrar's Office to allow the student to be re-instated.

ATTENTION!! ALL FIRST-TIME FRESHMEN ENTERING TEXAS SOUTHERN UNIVERSITY FALL 2007

The Texas Education Code, section 51.907*, now states that all first-time freshmen as of the fall semester of 2007 or later may be permitted to drop no more than six courses between initial enrollment in and graduation from Texas Southern University. This number includes any courses a transfer student may have dropped during enrollment at another institution of higher education in Texas.

Courses that are counted toward the six-course limit include the following:

1. the student was able to drop the course without receiving a grade (A, B, C, D, or F) or incurring an academic penalty
2. the student's transcript indicates or will indicate that the student was enrolled in the course (signified by a W grade)
3. the student is not dropping the course in order to withdraw from the University.

There may be exemptions from the above limit for good cause provided the student can document good cause. For information concerning exemptions visit www.em.tsu.edu. Also, any course dropped prior to September 10, 2007, will not count toward the six-course drop limit. Future deadlines may vary; however, they will be published as soon as they are determined.
